

OLD SPLANT "PIONEER" Endurance Ride September 1st, 2nd & 3rd 2023



We will offer 3 glorious days of riding in the breathtaking mountains of the beautiful Boise Basin. Come ride past historic sites where gold was discovered in 1862, and beautiful treasures are still found today!

Day 1 – Friday September 1st, 25 and 50 mile endurance rides

Day 2 – Saturday September 2nd^d, 25 and 55 mile endurance rides

Day 3 – Sunday September 3rd, 25 and 50 mile endurance rides

<u>Directions:</u> From I-84 in Boise take Hwy 21 NE 36 miles to Idaho City. Turn Left (north) onto Montgomery St. At the end of the street, turn left (west) and continue for 7 miles (dirt road between towns) to Centerville. Turn right (north) onto Henry's creek Rd. and continue approx. ½ mile into camp.

<u>Camp:</u> Camp is on private ground. Weed Free Hay is required due to the use of Forest Service lands. Horse water will be supplied, but bring potable people water. **DOGS are always welcome**, but must be leashed at all times. Do NOT bring dogs to registration, vet area, ride meetings or awards dinner. **FIRE DANGER** is very real this time of year – only one community fire will be allowed, if any. Bring your own food. No meals provided.

<u>FEE Schedule:</u> For Competitive Distances (25-55 miles) \$125 for each day ridden. Current year/reciprocating ride managers 50%off (one day only; other days at full price). Non-AERC members will be subject to an additional \$15 per day non-member fee. Trail Riders \$35/ horse/rider pair. No non-member surcharge for trail riders. Idaho Riding Club Challenge: The Riding Club with the most trail riders for the weekend will win a special prize.

JUNIORS (under age 18 as of 1/1/23) ride FREE

<u>Starting Times:</u> 50 and 55 mile riders @ 6:00am; LDs @ 7:00am. Trail ride any time after 9am but no later than 3pm (trail riders must check in & out with ride management). Check-in and vetting to start approx. 4 pm on Thursday August 31st for Friday riders, Pre-vet times for Saturday and Sunday will be at the discretion of the Vets.

<u>Trails:</u> Trails are primarily old logging roads, ATV and single-track trials on private property, US Forest Service and Idaho State Lands. The terrain is mostly nice, sound footing with sandy surfaces, but there are some water crossings and rocky sections through dredged creek banks. **Hoof Protection is <u>STRONGLY</u> recommended** for all horses competing.
